Dance: Maree Fawke

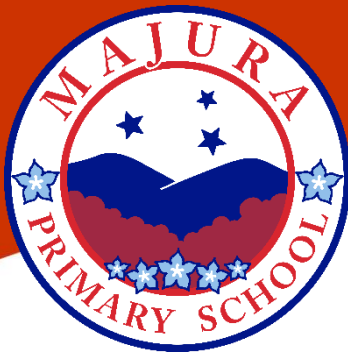
This semester preschool students will be participating in activities focussing on the elements of dance. Students will be encouraged to role play, imagine and explore movement, identifying and using body parts through fundamental movement skills.

Sustainability: Mel Chiles

Sustainability activities throughout Term 3 will continue to align with national days of environmental significance including: 'National Tree Day', 'Keep Australia Beautiful Week' and 'National Threatened Species Day'. Preschool students will continue to read stories, undertake art activities and role play how to look after animal species and the Australian environment. As the seasons change the students will be involved in learning about how Indigenous people use wattle and exploring garden design in line with Canberra's Floriade Festival.

Kids Active Play: Cheyenne Lewis

This term, children will further their balancing skills, such as walking on a beam or holding a pose. We will continue our throwing and catching skills, focusing on underarm and overarm throws. Towards the end of the term, we will move onto ball kicking skill. These lessons will be delivered through explicit instruction and reinforced through group games.
