EYLF:

Our focus this term is to provide time for our preschoolers to undergo a transition to school program. This is expected to provide learning opportunities and challenges as children navigate the primary school. Our activities will include formal visits to the Kinder classes, buddy sessions at the primary school, continued library sessions, and joining in assembly.

Our educational program this term will focus heavily on learning about names. This will include the appropriate use of upper case and lower-case letters, syllables and extending individual children where necessary.

SPECIALIST PROGRAMS

Music: Kirstyn Miller

Preschool children will continue to learn and perform a repertoire of simple songs and rhymes, which focus on developing their musical skills such as singing, listening, echoing, responding, moving, body percussion and playing percussion instruments and participation. There will be an explicit focus on playing a lollipop drum to accentuate the words and demonstrating their aural listening skills of high/low sounds through matching toys to high and low. Students will visually representing vocal exploration through sound drawings.

This term the preschool students will continue to take part in their 45-minute lessons focusing on Sustainability concepts. The students will be involved in activities that relate to important dates in the Australian Sustainability calendar including: 'National Water Week' and 'the Aussie Backyard Bird Count' (16-22 October), Nude Food Week (23-27 October) and 'National Recycling Week' (13-19 November). Preschool students will also be involved in developing their gardening skills and parents are invited to help build a compost heap for the preschool.
